The Regional Commission is now hiring for a Regional Planner II- Senior: Economic and Community Development

Position Description

The Regional Planner: Economic and Community Development performs advanced professional planning activities of high complexity and variety focused on community and economic development in the Regional Commission service area. This Regional Planner spends significant time developing and leading projects in our Economic Development Administration and Appalachian Regional Commission programs. Typical duties might include grant-writing, local comprehensive plan assistance and development, CDBG project management, state and federal stakeholder relationship management, rural project development, and more. This position will also lead our Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) process, including coordinating the schedule and content of committee meetings, soliciting and managing project submissions, updating of the CEDS report and concordant website and online dashboards, and general relationship management with our EDA partners. Planners at this level exercise greater independence and judgment. This position is supervised by the Director of Community Development Programs.

Salary Range

The salary range for this position is \$45,000 to \$60,000 based on education and experience

The James River in Botetourt and Alleghany Counties provides access to boating, tubing, camping, and more. Almost half of member government Craig County is part of the Jefferson National Forest. We have the Blue Ridge Parkway, and a mountain in the middle of our urban center with the largest, free-standing, man-made, illuminated star in the world, the Mill Mountain Star, on top.

The City of Roanoke is a League of American Bicyclists recognized Bicycle Friendly Community, and the Regional Commission was recently designated a Gold-level Bicycle Friendly Business.

If you want to hike, ride, boat, camp, climb, or stargaze, working for the Regional Commission puts you in a place where you can access any of this in a short drive, and sometimes even right from your front porch.

Typical Work Tasks

- Manages the CEDS report updates and management of the CEDS committee to support regional economic development goals;
- Performs advanced professional work related to variety of planning assignments;
- Manages complex planning studies, development applications, and reviews consultant proposals;
- Reviews and processes complex comprehensive plan amendments, rezonings, annexations, site plans, and plats;
- Develops project budgets, verifies contract expenditures, and compliance;
- Conducts research and prepares statistical reports on land use, physical, social, and economic issues;
- Provides professional planning assistance to member communities on various projects;
- Develops professional plans, studies, and analysis on a regional basis;
- Schedules and conducts meetings with advisory boards and elected officials;
- Presents reports and other findings to staff, working groups, and appointed and elected boards;
- Attends substantial number of evening meetings;
- Supervises more junior planners within the organization; and
- Performs other duties as assigned.
- Represents the Roanoke Valley-Alleghany Regional Commission at various meetings in a professional manner in presentations, meetings, and interactions with the public and elected and appointed officials.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

The candidate must have:

- Extensive knowledge of the philosophies, principles, practices, and techniques of planning;
- Well-developed knowledge of one or more planning disciplines;
- Ability to perform research and data collection;
- Excellent written and oral communication skills for preparing and presenting planning reports and projects;



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- Excellent interpersonal skills for facilitating relationships with elected/appointed officials or other decision-makers:
- Ability to work on several projects or issues simultaneously and effectively meet firm deadlines;

The ideal candidate will also have:

- Familiarity with the CEDS process and EDA Partnership Planning program;
- Familiarity with the Appalachian Regional Commission and its various programs and projects;
- Experience with other Federal agencies and programs that support community and economic development, especially in rural areas;
- Experience with ArcGIS;
- Experience accessing and using Census and other data sources;

Preferred Education and Experience

Any combination of education and experience equivalent to graduation from an accredited college or university with a BA/BS degree in planning, geography, public administration, or business with a minimum of seven years of relevant experience; OR master's degree in the aforementioned fields with a minimum of five years of relevant experience. AICP preferred.

Continuing Education

This position is a mid- to high-level of a professional development track. Dedication and willingness to continue education through attendance of conferences; participation in professional associations; and/or completion of courses, certificates, seminars, or distance learning modules is encouraged.

Physical Effort, Dexterity, Visual Acuity, Hearing, and Speaking

The physical exertion requirements of this job are classified as sedentary work. In general, lifting or carrying tasks are not more than 10 pounds. A certain amount of walking and standing is often necessary to carry out job duties. The job requires normal visual acuity, depth perception and field of vision. Individuals must be able to speak clearly in person and over the phone.
