SMYTH PROMISE: Empowering Future Generations through Education

Background of Identified Problem

The Smyth County Promise program represents a transformative initiative aimed at addressing the educational and workforce development needs of Smyth County, Virginia. Developed through a collaborative effort between the Smyth County Board of Supervisors, the Smyth County Community Foundation, Virginia Highlands Community College (VHCC), and Wytheville Community College (WCC), this innovative scholarship program is designed to provide tuition-free access to higher education for local high school graduates.

Smyth County faces significant challenges related to post-secondary education and workforce development. Many students, particularly in rural areas, lack access to affordable higher education and technical training programs essential for meeting the demands of the modern workforce. The Smyth County Promise program directly addresses these challenges by offering a "last-dollar" scholarship, covering tuition costs not met by other financial aid sources, thereby eliminating financial barriers to post-secondary education.

Executive Summary

Starting with the class of 2023, graduates from any Smyth County public, private, or home school are

eligible for the Smyth County Promise scholarship. The program is applicable at VHCC and WCC for up

to six consecutive semesters, depending on the student's course of study. To qualify, students must complete

a straightforward three-step process: apply for college enrollment, submit a FAFSA application, and

complete the scholarship application with their chosen community college.

The impact of the Smyth County Promise program is profound. By facilitating easier access to education

and training, the program empowers students to pursue careers in diverse fields, from healthcare to skilled

trades. This initiative not only enhances individual career prospects but also strengthens Smyth County's

workforce and economic vitality. Additionally, the program emphasizes community engagement through a

requirement of 10 volunteer hours per semester, fostering civic responsibility among scholarship recipients.

Leadership from VHCC, WCC, and local officials including the Smyth County Board of Supervisors,

Smyth County School Board and the Smyth County Community Foundation have expressed enthusiastic

support for the program. They recognize its role in advancing educational attainment and workforce

readiness within the county, aligning with broader goals of improving health, wellness, and education.

Smyth Promise Scholarship provides full tuition and fees, to Virginia Highlands Community College OR

Wytheville Community College, for all qualified residents who graduate from Smyth County Public

Schools or attended home school, or private schools in Smyth County, as a "last dollar" scholarship

that is applied after all other scholarships, financial aid, and grants are awarded. Requirements for the

program are listed below.

Eligibility:

o Open to all graduating Smyth County Public School students, as well as graduates from

Smyth County private schools or home schools.

Scholarship Details:

o Covers tuition and fees for five of six consecutive semesters at VHCC or WCC, starting

from the Summer or Fall semester immediately after high school graduation.

o Recipients can enroll in degree or workforce programs at the colleges.

Academic Requirements:

Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 to receive funding for the second year.

Community Service Requirement:

Complete 10 hours of community service per semester at approved agencies (list of

approved agencies provided).

Application Process:

Apply to VHCC or WCC and fulfill all admission requirements.

o Complete the Federal Student Aid Form (FAFSA).

o Submit VHCC or WCC's Scholarship Application (applies to the Smyth Promise

Scholarship and other scholarships).

Register for classes at VHCC or WCC.

Program Results

The Smyth Promise program has had a significant impact on the educational opportunities for Smyth

County students, providing over 80 scholarships to pursue higher education in the first year. This initiative

aimed to reduce financial barriers and encourage local students to pursue their academic goals without the

burden of tuition costs, thus promoting educational equity within the community.

In parallel, the *Teachers for Tomorrow* program represents a strategic expansion and evolution of the Smyth

Promise initiative. This new program, a collaboration between Smyth County Schools, local community

colleges (Wytheville Community College and Virginia Highlands Community College), and Emory &

Henry College, specifically targets students interested in becoming educators. It addresses the critical need

for qualified teachers within Smyth County by providing a streamlined pathway from high school to a teaching career.

Key Features of Teachers for Tomorrow (the following is a summary extracted from the program marketing materials)

Financial Support: Students graduating from Smyth County Schools receive free tuition at
community colleges (Wytheville and Virginia Highlands) through the Smyth County Promise
Scholarship. Emory & Henry College offers reduced tuition of \$7,500 per year for the final two
years of their bachelor's degree in teaching.

2. *Structured Pathway:* The program is structured as a 1+1+2 model:

 Year 1: Dual-enrollment classes during senior year of high school and community college coursework (tuition-free).

• Years 2 and 3: Community college coursework covered by the Smyth Promise Scholarship.

 Years 3 and 4: Completion of bachelor's degree at Emory & Henry College with reduced tuition (\$15,000 total for both years).

3. *Educational Partnerships:* Collaboration between educational institutions (Smyth County Schools, community colleges, and Emory & Henry College) ensures a seamless educational pathway, integrating classroom learning with practical teaching experience within Smyth County Schools.

4. *Community Impact:* The program not only addresses the financial barriers to education but also fosters a local pipeline of well-trained educators who are likely to remain in the community, thereby contributing to the long-term educational and social development of Smyth County.
